It would be mowed and cleared in time for the 4th of July celebration and fireworks, if needed.

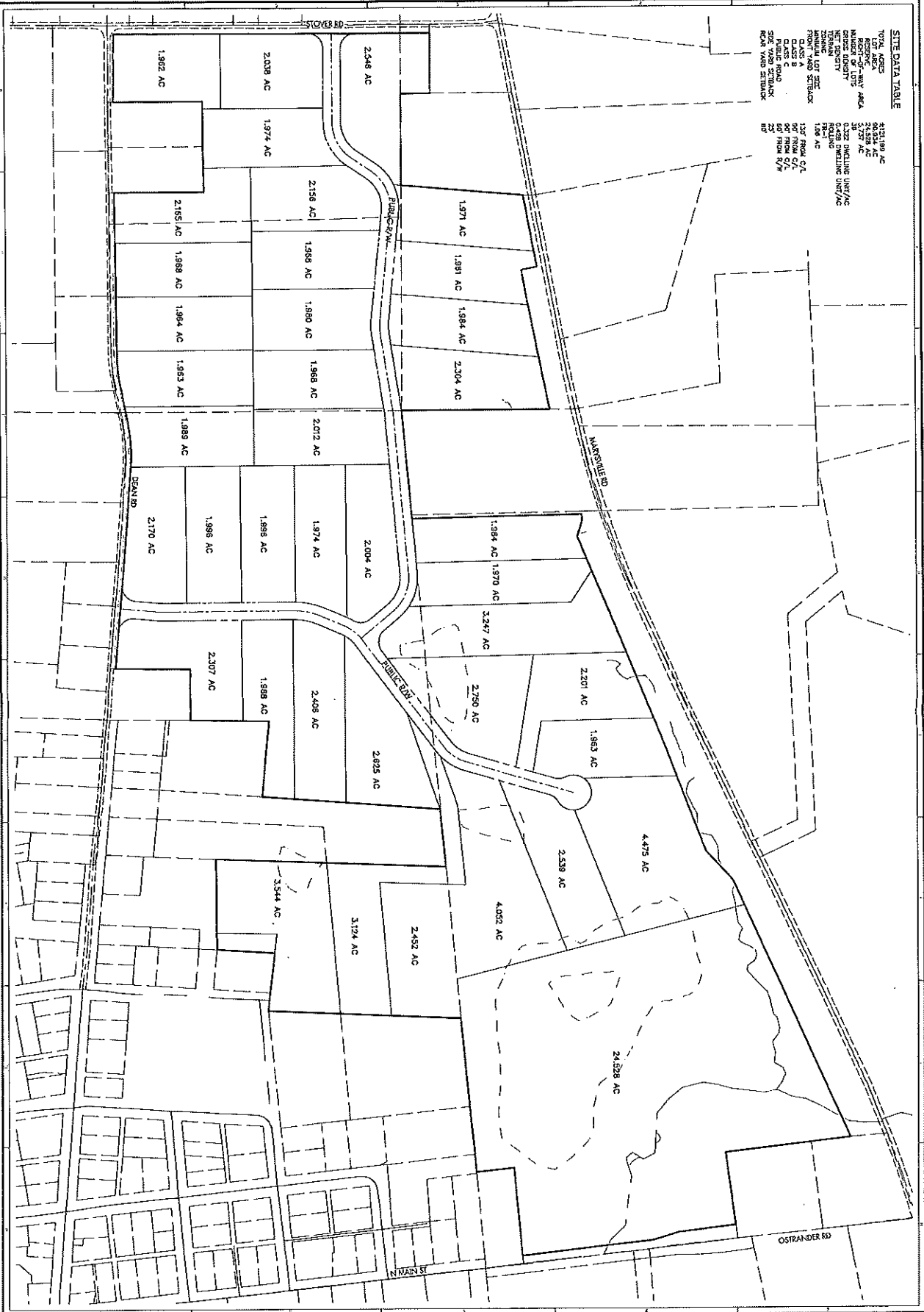

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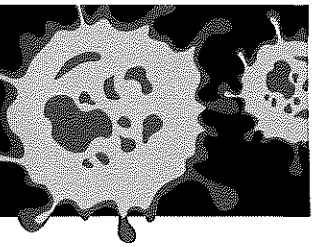

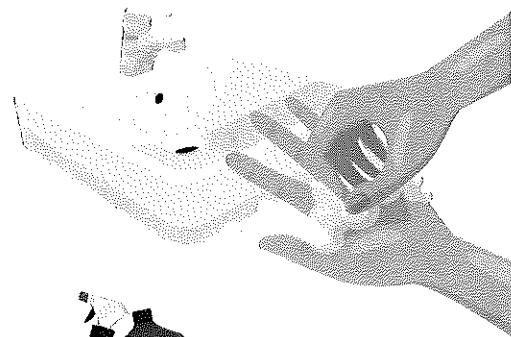
STOP THE "STOMACH BUG" SPREAD

Norovirus is the #1 cause of diarrhea or vomiting outbreaks spread by direct contact with an infected person or touching a contaminated surface.

Follow these steps to stop the spread!

WASH HANDS

Wash your hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds each time and avoid touching your mouth.



CLEAN SURFACES

Clean frequently-touched surfaces using a bleach-based cleaner to disinfect surfaces along with other objects that are frequently touched.

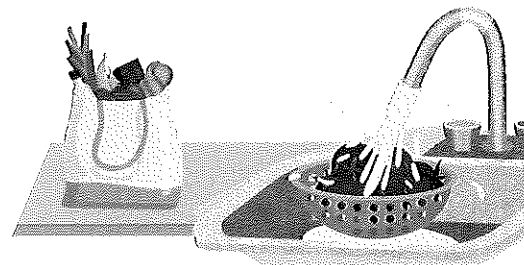


WASH LAUNDRY

Remove and wash soiled clothes and linens immediately, then tumble dry.

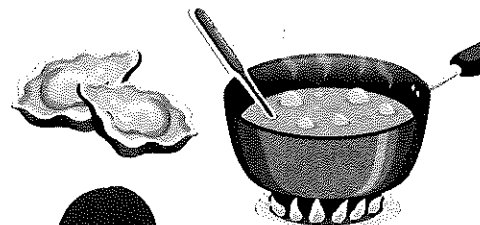
RINSE FRUITS & VEGGIES

Norovirus on food can make you sick. Rinse fresh fruits and vegetables before eating them.



COOK SHELLFISH

Noroviruses can survive low cooking temps. Cook shellfish at 140°F or higher.



STAY HOME IF SICK

When you're sick, don't prepare food or care for others. Wait 2-3 days after you recover.

Board of Health Member Opening

What:	The Delaware District Advisory Council (DAC) is currently accepting letters of interest from people who would like to serve as a member of the Delaware Public Health District Board of Health. This Board appointment will serve a five-year term that expires in March 2028.
Who:	The appointment will be made with regards to equal representation of all parts of the Health District. The DAC may consider the applicant's place of residence and employment. Delaware Public Health District serves approximately 220,000 residents in 18 townships, 4 villages, and 3 cities in and around Delaware County (except portions annexed to Westerville, Columbus, and Dublin).
How to Apply:	Interested parties are encouraged to submit a letter of interest and qualifications to: Delaware County District Advisory Council, c/o Delaware Public Health District – Garrett Guillozet, Health Commissioner, PO Box 570, Delaware, OH 43015 or to gguillozet@delawarehealth.org . Nominations will also be taken during the meeting.
When:	The DAC will meet on Thursday, March 23, 2023, at 7:00 p.m. It is a public meeting and interested parties are encouraged to attend. The meeting will be held at 1 West Winter Street, Delaware, OH 43015.
Meetings & Duties	The nine-member Board of Health currently meets on the last Tuesday of every month at 7:00 p.m. Meetings typically last two hours and are held at 1 West Winter Street, Delaware, OH 43015. Board Members are compensated \$80 per meeting.
About the Board of Health	<p>The Delaware Public Health District Board of Health is the governing body for the district's health department. Responsibilities include establishing public health programs, appointing and employment of staff, financial management and rule-making authority. Board of Health members are appointed by elected officials who serve on the District Advisory Council or by the city they represent.</p> <p>As a combined health district, the number of board members is determined by contracts between the city health districts and the general health district (the area of the county exclusive of cities). In our health district, the contracts call for two members to be appointed by the City of Delaware, one member to be appointed by the City of Powell, one member to be appointed by the City of Sunbury, and five members to be appointed by the District Advisory Council from the remainder of the health district.</p> <p>Among the board members, one position must be filled by a physician. The state law also requires geographical representation from the area served. The provisions for appointments to boards of health are addressed in Ohio Revised Code.</p>
