Age-Friendly Bench Policy Recommendations

Age-Friendly is an international effort led by the World Health Organization and facilitated in the U.S. by AARP. The initiative encourages cities, counties, and states to prepare for the rapid aging of our population by working together to strengthen and advance our communities. The initiative's ideology holds that making a community more age-friendly is good for citizens of all ages and abilities.

The senior population in Delaware County is growing. By 2030, the 55-and-older population is projected to be 30.40% or 74,550 residents. Unfortunately, as the older adult population grows, so does the prevalence of chronic conditions and social isolation in this population.

In Delaware County, 72% of older adults (65 and over) are either overweight or obese, and 15% rated their health status as fair or poor. Chronic conditions in Delaware County older adults are prevalent with 58% having been diagnosed with high blood cholesterol, and 64% with high blood pressure. Getting regular exercise of just 150 minutes of moderate physical activity per week has been linked to a reduction in heart disease, cancer, falls, and cognitive impairment due to dementia. According to the 2018 Age-Friendly survey, 69% of respondents reported exercising every day to several times per week.

Outdoor Spaces and Buildings is one of the six focus areas for Age-Friendly Delaware County. It provides safe and accessible indoor and outdoor places for people of all ages to gather and engage in community. The outside environment and public buildings have a major impact on the mobility, independence, and quality of life for older adults, as well as their ability to age in place.

Parks are particularly important to older adults because walking is their most common form of physical activity. Providing age-friendly parks, which pay particular attention to mobility restrictions imposed by older age, are critical to encouraging seniors' physical activity, which promotes good health and prevents social isolation. The park must also be easily accessible and free of obstacles. We heard from older adults that many Delaware County public spaces do not have a place to rest, making them less accessible. Age-friendly benches that are fitted with handrails are a simple way to provide support and stability to those that require a little extra help with transitioning from a seated to standing position and vice versa. The seats on the benches should be slightly higher than standard (18') if possible, and they should have sturdy backrests and handrails to make it easier to sit down and get up. Space for wheelchairs should be provided beside the benches.

Other quick additions to make your park more senior-friendly:

- Make sure your paths are wide enough for wheelchairs and walkers.
- Add plenty of age-friendly benches along pathways for people to take a rest.
- Offer greater choices—passive or active recreation, sun, or shade.
- Provide senior-friendly activities.




